Catching Up with YOC Alumni



David Stultz, a native of Chattanooga TN, Was the winner of the 2015 Young Organist Competition. He studied piano with Dr. Sigrid Luther for fifteen years and began organ study with Jason DuRoy and Dr. Sarah Harr. In high school he began organ lessons with Dr. Edie Johnson at the University of Tennessee. It was a logical step to continue his undergraduate studies with her as an undergraduate organ major from 2017 to 2021 when he received a bachelor's degree in Organ Performance.

In the summer of 2021, he won first prize in the

Southeast Regional AGO Competition for Young Organists. In the summer of 2022, he was invited to perform at the National AGO Convention in Seattle, Washington. He also passed the AGO Service Playing Certification Exam in 2020 and the AGO Colleague Certification Exam in 2021. Throughout his service playing career, David held positions as organist at First Presbyterian Church of Chattanooga, Lookout Mountain Presbyterian Church, and Second Presbyterian Church in Knoxville, Tennessee where he also served as the Assistant Director of Music.

He received a full tuition scholarship and assistantship stipend to pursue a master's degree in Sacred Music and Organ Performance at the University of Notre Dame (South Bend, Indiana) where he studied with Dr. Kola Owolabi. On April 23, 2023, David presented his final degree recital in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart (Notre Dame).

In the Fall of 2023, David began doctoral studies in sacred music and organ with Professor Nicole Keller at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. Presently, David is serving as Associate Director of Sacred Music at St. Hugo of the Hills Parish in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.

David also enjoys composing for keyboard and choir. Many of his compositions and organ recordings can be viewed on his YouTube channel by searching "David Stultz Organ."

In addition to music, David is occasionally commissioned as an oil painter specializing in classical and impressionistic landscapes, portraits, and still life.

A true Renaissance man, David is another of our YOC alumni that continue to make us proud!


