


## **Young Organist Competition 2025 Canceled**

Sunday, March 9, 2025

March 9 is Woman Composer Sunday. Established in 2021 by the Society of Women Organists and Royal College of Organists in the United Kingdom and adopted a year later by the American Guild of Organists, Woman Composer Sunday raises awareness of the contributions of female composers during Women's History Month.

AGO Members are encouraged to include works by women in their services and other performances on this day and hundreds of organists are expected to participate. The AGO Task Force for Gender Equity has compiled a number of resources, including repertoire lists, and three winning compositions from the 2025 Woman Composer Sunday Organ Competition Contest were published in the January, February, and March issues of The American Organist magazine.

Still looking for interesting pieces you can perform? Members of the AGO Young Organists (AGOYO) recorded many works in 2023 as part of their Women Composers Project, and the individual selections are being posted daily on the official AGO Facebook page, www.Facebook.com/AGOhq. You can check them out and don't forget to "like" and share them with your friends.

You can also spread the word by posting a video of your performance (observe copyright restrictions) or photographs on your Facebook or Instagram account. The video doesn't have to be fancy, a smartphone will do the job. And, don't forget to include the hashtag #WomanComposerSunday with your post, so AGO National can share your videos on their social media feeds.

**Catching Up with YOC Alumni** 



Since beginning his musical training at age ten, Raymond Hawkins has honed his skill at the organ through an active career in both solo performance and sacred music. As a performer, Raymond has given recitals at venues across the United States, including the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in San Francisco and Adolphus Busch Hall at Harvard University. His performance at the 2015 Piccolo Spoleto Festival in Charleston, South Carolina was praised in *The American Organist* as being "superbly played and registered."

Since 2019, Raymond has served as Director of

Music and Organist at St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Marblehead, Massachusetts. There, he oversees choral and organ music for weekly Mass, monthly Evensong, and a variety of other occasions. Raymond also serves as Member-at-Large and Newsletter Editor for the Merrimack Valley Chapter of AGO.

Raymond began his career in church music at the age of fourteen as organist at the First Baptist Church of Holly Hill, South Carolina. While studying in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, he served as music intern at Augsburg Lutheran Church and subsequently as organist at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church.

Raymond has also won prizes in a number of regional and national competitions. As a high school junior, he received First Prize and the Hymn-Playing Prize in the 2014 UNCSA/Salem College High School Organ Competition as well as Third Place and the Hymn-Playing Prize in the Greater Columbia AGO Chapter's Young Organist Competition; the following year he earned Second Place in the same competition. In 2014, he won Second Place in the Senior Division of the Peter Perret Youth Talent Search and consequently performed with the Winston-Salem Symphony Orchestra.

In 2019, Raymond completed his undergraduate degree in organ performance at the

University of North Carolina School of the Arts, where he studied as a Kenan Organ Scholar under Dr. Timothy Olsen and had previously received his high school diploma. Earlier on, he studied organ with Donna Swanson, Angela Kraft Cross, and Porter Remington. Raymond has also studied abroad in the United Kingdom, France, Germany, and the Netherlands, advancing his skills as both musician and language aficionado.


