Question of the Month

If you are a sub, what is your average pay per service. Does this include choir music and rehearsal?

If you are a regular organist, what is the average you pay for a sub for a service. Does this include choir music and rehearsal?

AGO National Standards:

SUBSTITUTE MUSICIANS

- Single service (organist only or director only, no separate rehearsal), \$100-\$225
- Additional services (organist or director only) not requiring additional preparation, \$50-\$125
- Single service (organist-director combination, no separate rehearsal), \$150-\$275
- Additional services (organist-director combination) not requiring additional preparation, \$75-\$175
- Rehearsal fees range from \$25-\$100/hour, depending on whether the substitute is organist only, director only, or organist-director combination and the preparation required
- Mileage of 44.5 cents/mile is charged if visits to church for practice, rehearsal, and service exceed 20 miles per round trip.
- The charge for contracting singers/instrumentalists is \$15-\$35/person hired.

WHAT YOU SAID:

I pay \$150 per Sunday. It's one service, with a choir rehearsal prior to that.

Organist

We pay \$100 per (*service*) or 2 hour mid-week choir rehearsal to an organist or organist/choirmaster. Organist

On average I receive \$150 for a Sunday morning substitute with no Wednesday choir rehearsal. If I do a Wednesday rehearsal, I usually receive \$175. Only in one instance have I been given extra money for mileage. The \$150 stands whether it's one, two or three services on Sunday morning.

Organ sub

My sub pay varies. I get \$250 at xxxx. I got paid \$150 from the xxxxx... I used to get \$125 a Sunday when I played at xxxxxxx ... There's a pretty wide range as far as salary goes... Most subbing doesn't require a choir rehearsal. When I work with the choir ... I get \$40.

Organ sub

I pay my sub \$150 for one service. She does rehearse with the choir Sunday before the service, and Wednesday evening if I asked her to do so. Now that I have a second service, I would probably pay her an additional \$50 for the other service. (She was a former organist / choir master at my church.)

Organist

I paid subs \$125.00 per service with no rehearsal other than 30 minutes before service on sunday morning.

Organist

we usually offer \$150 for 1 service on Sunday morning. I do not ask the sub to come to a choir rehearsal, and they play something for the offertory - no anthem.

Organist

When I sub, I usually get \$150 for a service, no rehearsal. For each identical service (same day) I get \$50 more and for each rehearsal (different day) and additional \$50.

Organ sub

My pay is \$75/week, including music and weekly rehearsals.

interim contemporary music director

\$200 for a regular service with Sunday morning choir practice, \$150 for funerals, and \$100 for lesser services
Organ sub

Our church pays a sub \$200 to play the two Sunday morning services (these two services are essentially the same). This does not include playing choir rehearsal on Wed night. If that is required we pay an additional \$150 to play the rehearsal.

Organist

We pay a sub \$75 per service

Organist

My average pay per service is 100.00:This usually <u>does</u> include choir music, but <u>doesn't</u> include A midweek rehearsal.

Organ sub

My average in the last few years has been \$150 for one service and that includes a choir rehearsal immediately prior to the service. There is an charge of \$50 for any additional service if the music remains the same.

Organ sub

I pay usually ~\$200 for an 8:30 service and an 11:00 service no choir practice. I have probably paid as much as \$250 for those 2 services.

Organist

We pay 150.00 for two services on Sunday morning. We have never had a sub come to the Wednesday night rehearsal.

Organist

Regarding payment for substitute organists, my church pays \$75 for each service, totaling \$150 for two services which are almost identical. There is no additional choir rehearsal other than the one immediately preceding the services.

Organist

... pays \$125 for Sunday service sub. No rehearsals, etc. included.

Organist

As a sub, I ask \$300 per Sunday plus mileage from xxxxx to whereever whether directing/playing or just playing.....this amount would include at least two 1.5-2 hour rehearsals prior to the Sunday service at the sub console. For a rehearsal, I would ask \$50-100.

Organ sub

My fee for a Sunday depends, but generally I get \$150 for just walking in and playing, with no choir. If I have to prepare/play/direct a choir, I ask for \$200. If a longer period where I have to choose anthems and conduct a midweek choir rehearsal also, I ask for \$250.

Organ sub

\$75-100 depending on the service. this does not include rehearsal. that would be an additional \$25 Organist

In response to your question..., the church pays \$50 per Sunday for a substitute.

Organist

...the jobs I have had have varied all the way from \$100 to \$150 for the same services (organist, with rehearsal).

Organ sub

Conclusions:

It appears that the average for Columbia is \$150 for one service and \$200 for 2 identical services on the same day. As you can see, the scale ranges, though, from \$50 to \$300 per service. I printed everyone's resonses so that you may draw your own conclusions to the data. All Church names, address, etc were removed so everyone can remain anonymous in their responses. Everyone who responded is a member of this chapter. I sincerely hope this helps.
